HISTORY OF PENDLE HILL FOOTBALL CLUB

The Pendle Hill Junior Soccer Club was founded in 1966 by Mr & Mrs Bob Doherty and began as a breakaway movement from Toongabbie Soccer Club. The first registration day was held at the home of the Doherty's – the fee being \$2.50.

In search of a home ground for the club an application was made to Blacktown Council for the lease of Binalong Park No.1. This being granted the club was admitted to the Granville District Soccer Association. The club then consisted of 8 teams of various age groups and by 1976 had grown to 25 teams including Cubs for 3 ½ - 5 year olds started by Dick Kocass in 1972. In 1976 the club added Binalong No.2 to the lease.

The Club was known as the Pendle Hill Tigers and adopted traditional tiger colours of black and gold. The original uniform was a black short sleeve shirt with a diagonal gold stripe running from the right shoulder on the front, black shorts and gold long socks with two black bands. The uniform has had many changes through the years including vertical stripes and a gold shirt with black collar and black sleeves and a black stripe down the right side of the shirt.
